Key Questions:

- **Continuity:** Should there be consistency across prekindergarten - grade 1 in what constitutes a full school day?
  - What does the term “instructional hours” mean in State Board Rules? Does this include play?
  - How many part-time K’s exist in VT schools? What should the standard for K be?
- **Dosage:** How many hours are developmentally appropriate for prekindergarten?
- **Flexibility:** How can options respond to family & community choice? (e.g. focus on hours/week instead of hours/day?)
  - How many school-based preks currently exist & are full?
- **Funding:** What are the financial implications of full day instruction? (e.g. impact of [ADM percentages](#))
