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The Vermont Multi-tiered System of Supports (VTmtss) Survey

- Fulfills legal requirements in 16 V.S.A. § 2904
- Facilitates priority setting and support provided to the field
- Informs the need for professional learning opportunities, technical assistance, and development of resources
- Identifies the provision of technical assistance for implementing the goals of Act 173 and Education Recovery needs

NOTE: This year's submission rate was 93 percent representing 278 schools across 52 Supervisory Unions and Supervisory Districts (SU/SD).



Key Findings

- Systemic and comprehensive approaches
- Increase in intention and action regarding social-emotional learning/mental health
- Educational Support Teams (EST) engage a variety of expertise
- # of EST Plans suggest a long-term case management model
- Need for more student voice
- Need for more meaningful family engagement



VTmtss Team Goals

- 1. Expand and improve district-level EST oversight
- 2. Support the creation of policies and practices that provide authentic inclusion of families in decisions impacting their students and school
- 3. Develop cultures of effective collaboration that include and respect students' voices
