		Notes: Gwen welcomed the group, welcomed Betty Roy to the Council. Council members shared what brings them to this work - commitment to learning, opportunity for all, literacy as a civil right, hope to increase achievement particularly for struggling learners, and more.

		Cynthia Gardner-Morse noted a change needed in the October 12 meeting minutes. She made a motion to approve the minutes with the change.
		Susan Koch seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. After the meeting Gwen found an error in a name in the October 18 subcommittee minutes, she requested it be fixed.

		Notes: There were not public comments. Council member Cynthia Gardner-Morse sent Gwen a question about recording the meetings. Gwen shared the question and indicated that she will research what other statewide Council's do for their meetings.

		Brief Questions/comments - 1 per member
		Notes: Glenn Bailey from the AOE presented information about disaggregated results from Smarter Balanced Assessment. His presentation indicated an approximate 50% proficiency rate of achievement across all of the grades on the English Language Arts SBAC assessment. The results show achievement in 4 domain areas: Reading, Writing, Listening & Speaking, and Research & Inquiry. English Language learners had far lower achievement than non-English Language learners. Blacks and American Indian or Alaskan Natives had far lower achievement than white students or other racial groups.
		Council members asked about the following: Susan Gray asked about the validity and norming of the SBAC assessment, specifically the normative sampling for racial groups. Glenn Bailey indicated that he would research and get back to the Council. Cynthia Gardner-Morse asked whether the scores for the general population had gone up or down since the 2019 results that were shared. Glenn indicated that it was difficult to tell based on reliability measures due to COVID. He recommended looking at school-based measured as a more reliable source of data for that information. Betty Roy asked if a similar presentation had been done about special education. Glenn Bailey indicated that he had done a presentation for the statewide special education directors. Gwen Carmolli indicated that a previous presentation included some special education results, but a presentation with more information could be done in the future. Barbie Collette offered appreciation for the information and wondered about the role race of the teacher has on the learning outcomes. Gwen Carmolli noted that the question connected well with previous presentations and discussions about the role educators play in instruction.
