

VSBPE Agenda Item 1(PAC) Date: Oct. 23, 2019 Item: Champlain College's Two-Year Report

ITEM: Shall the VSBPE approve Champlain College's Two-Year Report and grant continued full approval in the endorsement areas for which they were reviewed and approved in 2017?

AGENCY RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The agency recommends that the VSBPE approves Champlain College's Two-Year Report and grants continued full approval to their educator preparation program in the endorsement areas for which they were reviewed and approved in 2017.

BACKGROUND: Champlain had a successful ROPA review in the spring of 2017, and the VSBPE accepted the recommendation of the review team and granted full approval to their educator preparation programs in the areas of Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, English, Middle Grades ELA and Social Studies, and Social Studies. The report of the review team contained only two concerns that needed to be addressed: that the Pre-K Math and Science Methods course needed more explicit instruction on math practices and content; and that Praxis II scores in Elementary Social Studies content knowledge indicated a need to review all four core disciplines of the NCSS C3 Standards (Civics, Economics, History, and Geography).

RATIONALE: Champlain's Two-Year Report provides clear, valid evidence that they have addressed the two concerns from their review, including data on the most recent scores from their completers' Praxis II scores in the Elementary Social Studies area.

Dear Ellen and to the members of the VSBPE,

This letter is to introduce the Champlain College Traditional Undergraduate Program's Two-Year report. Although, we completed our full ROPA Institutional Portfolio and Site Visit in April 2017, we did not receive our approval letter until after the October 26, 2017 VSPBE meeting and thus after the two -year period of acceptance of the report, we are now submitting our Two-Year Report. Because of all of the links to supporting documents, I am submitting the report in a shared digital format. The \$500.00 fee has been requested to be sent by our business department to the AOE.

In the report, we address two concerns from ROPA Standard One: Content Knowledge and Pedagogy. The first concern was based on observations that the Pre-K Math and Science Methods course needed more explicit instruction on math practices and content. The second concern was related to Praxis II scores in Elementary Social Studies content knowledge, indicated a need to review all four core disciplines of the NCSS C3 Standards (Civics, Economics, History, and Geography). We believe we present evidence that we acted to address both concerns.

We appreciate the opportunity to reflect on our programs and to plan and take actions to improve our work through the ROPA review process.

This FAQ and Template is for Vermont Educator Preparation Programs who are completing their Two-Year ROPA Reports.

Q: What is a ROPA Two-Year Report?

A: From the ROPA Handbook, "Once the report of the Review Team has been accepted by the VSBPE, the institution must submit a report to the VSBPE within two years of the acceptance date. The report should begin by offering a brief overview of all programs seeking continued full approval, including the number of candidates enrolled in each program, and continue to describe any major changes at the institution that may impact the educator preparation program(s).

The Two-Year Report should offer a description of its overall progress on each of the program approval standards not found to provide *satisfactory* evidence at the time of the full-program review. Explain what steps the institution has taken as a whole to meet the standard. The report should go on to describe in detail how the institution and/or program have addressed the specific concerns and stipulations of the Review Team."

Q: Is there a template for the Two-Year Report?

A: Yes, it follows this FAQ.

Q: Does the Vermont Standards Board for Professional Educators (VSBPE) need to approve the report? A: Yes, if the VSBPE finds satisfactory progress, full approval of the program will be continued and extend for the next five years. Programs on conditional approval may be granted full approval at this time. If the progress is unsatisfactory, the VSBPE may decide to grant conditional approval for a given period of time or deny approval for the program. After the VSBPE meets to discuss your report, your institution (President and License Officer) will receive a letter summarizing their decision.

Q: What is the fee for the Two-Year Report?

A: The AOE fee for the Two-Year Report review is \$500 and should be included with the report at time of submission.

Q: Can the Annual Report be used as the Two-Year Report?

A: No, they serve separate functions and should be submitted separately in any year that both are due.

Champlain College is approved by the Vermont Standards Board for Professional Educators to recommend a person who satisfactorily completes the approved program as eligible for licensure and/or endorsement the following areas: Early Childhood Education (PK through grade 3/age 3 – age 8), Early Childhood Education with Infant/Toddler Endorsement (Birth through grade 3), Elementary Education (Grades K-6), English (Grades 7-12), Middle Grades: English (Grades 5-9), Middle Grades: Social Studies (Grades 5-9), and Social Studies (Grades 7-12).
