Dear Members of the VSBPE,

This year hundreds of educators teach under a provisional license in Vermont. Frequently, these are currently employed and licensed educators who are meeting a sudden need in their school to cover a content-area. These educators are often employed in the more rural areas of our state, making it difficult for them to access resources they need to add the endorsement through the traditional means of taking coursework. TAP is driven to support both rural supervisory unions in "growing their own teachers" and provisionally licensed teachers in adding needed endorsements to their professional teaching license.

We are writing to request approval to conduct a pilot program in order to support practicing educators in adding an endorsement area. My own participation in the ROPA Review of the VTHEC program uniquely positions me to understand both the state's needs and the existing procedures for educators adding an endorsement. We would like to pilot a program, in collaboration with mentors and building principals, where we support educators in the creation and implementation of their own Personalized-Learning Plan that would enable them to meet endorsement requirements without leaving their classroom.

We hope by offering such a program we can take some of the pressure off the licensing office and the Peer Review program and limit the number of educators seeking an extension of their provisional license. Most importantly, we hope to support students in receiving instruction from fully licensed teachers in all content areas.

The closures of educator preparation programs in the last five years also means that educators' options have grown more limited in the state for seeking professional development coursework. It is our hope that our additional endorsement model would allow us to better meet the needs of Vermont's schools and educators while maintaining the strength of the TAP program.

We anticipate that we would pilot this program for two years to allow us the opportunity to determine the necessity and the operation of this process before requesting a full review of our process during our next scheduled ROPA Review in 2024. We will provide an update and status report in a year.

Thank you for considering this request. We offer a summary of the pilot proposal on the attached page and would welcome the opportunity to meet with the VSBPE to answer questions and consider the value of such a program.

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## Steps for Adding a Teaching Endorsement with TAP

## Requirements:

- 1. Must be a current Vermont teacher
- 2. Must hold a current Vermont educator license in an endorsement which requires meeting Vermont's Core Teaching Standards
- 3. Must be seeking a K-12 specialty endorsement (music, ETS, art, PE, Health) OR a middle/high school endorsement
- 4. \$1000 payment to TAP, \$300 of which goes directly to mentor support

In order to be recommended for an additional endorsement, you will need:

- 1. An approved content-area text
- 2. A completed endorsement area proficiencies template
- 3. A content-area mentor
- 4. A Content-Area Personalized-Learning Plan
- 5. 60 hour practicum in the content-area (or embedded in job)
- 6. Two formal observations, video evidence, and reflections
- 7. Sample lesson plans
- 8. Final summary self-assessment.
- 9. Passing score on Praxis 2 Subject Area Test.
