3. (PARTNERSHIPS) A viable partnership or partnership(s) exist between a school, community agency, faith-based organization, municipality and/or individual community partners or people or private organizations that will be successful to support the program over time.	-Existing partners to leverage? -Think organizations and/or individual partnerships -Review all community resources -Are there any program "competitors?" or existing providers to engage and/or unify?		
4. (SCHOOL-COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP) The school principal and other school (and/or community) leaders are committed to being active participants, supporters and/or leaders of the program.	-Level of leadership buy-in and support at the school and district level -Level of non-school community capacity and support		



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5. (HIGH QUALITY STAFF) High quality staff including school-based teachers and staff, community professionals, and/or educators and others are available to work in the program.			



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6. (ORGANIZATION) A strong organizational structure exists that has the capacity to support the project including a director and site leaders, and staff. The organization has the capacity to take on increased evaluation, financial and legal responsibilities	-Business office, IT, and HR system capacity exists to add new staff, jobs, and structure -Functionality and adaptability and use of systems that support equity such as communications and Special Education		



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7.(SPACE AND RESOURCES) Full access to high quality space in the school and/or community including classrooms, gyms, multi-purpose rooms, cafeterias, libraries, and access to technology and nature can be used as part of the program.	-Level and diversity of building usage -Sharing of computers and books -Sharing of classrooms in schools		
8. (EXPERIENCE) The site, personnel, and organization have a successful history running a program or related initiative at a scale commensurate to the funding expectation.	-Leveraging existing programs and partnerships -Existing funding, if any -Working from strengths		



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9. (TIME and PLANNING) Someone within a team has enough time leading a team through a visioning, research, planning, design, and writing process	-Organizing team collaboration -Writing ability -Effective project management -Clarity of Vision -Program champions		
10. (BEST PRACTICE, RESEARCH AND EVIDENCE). Knowledge is brought to bear on the program plan for best effect	-Participation in trainings -Visiting existing programs -Using generative AI and other resources
