State and National Assessment Timeline and Schedule Information

Timelines and Schedules for College and Career Readiness Assessments

ACT: The ACT has rescheduled its April 4, 2020, national test date to June 13, 2020, across the U.S. in response to concerns about the spread of the COVID-19. <u>ACT's April 2020 National Exam COVID-19 FAQ</u>.

Smarter Balanced Interim Assessments: Smarter Balanced developed two types of interim assessments: Individual Assessment Blocks (IABs) and Interim Comprehensive Assessments (ICAs). IABs are more targeted and drill down to skill levels, while ICAs are more comprehensive and mimic the summative assessments. More information will be published regarding appropriate use of the interim assessments in a remote learning environment; however, there is a brochure available in the VTCAP Portal that provides guidance on administering an interim assessment.

Important Note: Although the interim assessments will be made available for educators to use remotely, these items are to be handled in a secure manner. Official guidance on using the interim assessments in your distance learning environment is forthcoming.

<u>AIRWays Reporting Tool</u>: Interim assessments use the same reporting tool as the Smarter Balanced summative assessments.
