REVIEW FINDINGS

A. Meal Access and Reimbursement

1. Certification and Benefit Issuance – Validation of the SFA certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals

Finding Detail: There were incorrectly categorized applications and additional information needed to document students directly certified via another student in the household.

2. Verification – Validation of the process used by the SFA to confirm selected students' eligibility for free and reduced-price meals

Finding Detail: The SFA should have verified 2 applications, but only 1 was verified.

3. Meal Counting and Claiming – Validation of the SFA meal counting and claiming system that accurately counts, records, consolidates, and reports the number of reimbursable meals claimed by category

Finding Detail: August 2022 and September 2022 meal counts at Barre Town Middle and Elementary School were not tracked by student name or eligibility status. Meal counts for the kindergarten and first grade students were not taken at the Point of Service. The meal counting system did not prevent overt identification of free and reduced-price meal status.

 Meal Components and Quantities – Validation that meals claimed for reimbursement contain the required meal components / food components and quantities

Finding Detail: There was no milk choice and not enough fruit offered at breakfast. Not all grains served were whole grain-rich. Not all products had the necessary documentation to validate their contribution to the meal pattern.

Finding Detail: There was no reimbursable signage. Staff did not know how to identify a reimbursable meal.
