

Vermont's Policy & Practice Drivers: Existing Drivers to Support Literacy



Vermont Literacy Blueprint Playbook

What: AOE has partnered with <u>Region 1 Comprehensive Center (R1CC)</u> to develop the *Vermont Literacy Playbook,* a guide for implementing <u>Vermont's</u> <u>Blueprint for Early Literacy Comprehensive System of Services (the</u> Blueprint). Online Literacy Learning Modules & LMS (I)

What: Understanding the Neuroscience of Reading, in the new online asynchronous course *Building a Strong Foundation for Lifelong Literacy Success developed by PCG* <u>announced</u>. Will provide an understanding how the brain learns to read, universal strategies to develop literacy skills and evidence-based literacy practices.

- Module 1: conceptual models for how to teach reading based on neuro and cognitive science.
- Modules 2-6: concentrate on the needs of educators who teach or support students K–3 and 4-12.
- The learning modules will be available on the new AOE State Learning Management System (LMS), PEPPER, for all Vermont educators.

Vermont Framework for Proficiency -Professional Learning and Coaching

What: Through a contract Great Schools Partnership (GSP) will provide professional learning and coaching to leaders in schools across Vermont focused on contextualizing the Vermont Portrait of a Graduate (PoG), support community conversations to collect data to inform a local portrait and refine the Personalized Learning Planning process to showcase evidence of proficiency and growth towards the attributes of the PoG. In the winter, performance assessment development work will begin.

Effective Use of Local Assessment Data -Professional Learning and Coaching (II)

What: *The Systematic Use of Data to Improve Student Learning* course through Vermont University at Castleton is available for free to SU/SD participants through an AOE contract. There are three 6-hour in-person sessions, and nine 2-hour virtual sessions. This course includes a 3-credit option available for an additional \$150/credit. It is designed for educator teams and their leaders with the goal of building an insightful data-use culture, where all teachers and administrators regularly and collaboratively leverage a variety of assessments to improve student learning and teacher practices.

Benchmark Assessment Grant Round 3

- 1. Purchase a new benchmark assessment system(s) for ELA (or math) that report Lexile (or Quantile) measures;
- Extend the grade levels assessed with current benchmark assessment system(s);
- 3. Fund staff participation in the Educator Academy for Lexile Frameworks.
