The 2018-19 round of 21c funding remained competitive. There were 10 applications requesting \$2,835,439, with approximately \$2,300,000 million dollars available for distribution.

This was the first year that the online Grants Management System (GMS) was used for 21C Application submissions.

There were three parts to the review process. In phase one, each proposal was reviewed by five reader/panelists who assigned points and comments to each section of the application using criteria that were specified in a scoring guide.

In phase two of the process, proposals were then re-reviewed a second time within a panel of experts in education, afterschool programs, and organizational leadership. Panelists were were asked to reanalyze the scores and comments, make decisions on each application, and set conditions for funding an application, if necessary.

The third and final step of the process was that the Agency of Education (AOE) reviewed the panel's work, compiled results, lightly edited panelist comments, and assured that all conditions for funding were met. A brief summary of the final application status follows.
