

## **Grammar and Writing Resources**

- <u>Daily Grammar</u> is a series of online lessons and quizzes, covering all aspects of grammar, from parts of speech to punctuation.
- <u>Eleven Grammar Hub</u> is a collection of guides, online quizzes, and articles about grammar.
- <u>Grammar Bytes!</u> is a site that offers many resources, including a weekly grammar workout, common grammar definitions, interactive exercises, videos, and more.
- <u>Grammarly</u> helps students correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation errors in their writing, improving their writing ability as they do so.
- <u>Keys to Literacy</u> is a website devoted to literacy professional development for K-12 educators. It includes free resources such as templates and printables, videos, and webinars.
- <u>Khan Academy</u> is a customizable series of online learning modules and practice exercises that increase in difficulty at the pace of the student.
- <u>NoRedInk</u> uses interest-based curricula, adaptive exercises, and actionable data to improve student writing. Using the bank of practice activities and quizzes, teachers can create diagnostics and assignments for their classes.
- <u>Purdue Online Writing Lab (OWL)</u> provides extensive resources and instructional materials for many types of writing projects, including research and citation, subject-specific writing, and job search writing.
- <u>Quill</u> offers learning opportunities, such as Quill Connect, to combine sentences; Quill Diagnostic, to identify learning gaps; Quill Proofreader, to practice fixing errors in passages; and Quill Grammar, to practice basic mechanics.
- <u>The Vermont Writing Collaborative</u> is a non-profit organization founded by public school teachers with the goal of improving reading, writing, and thinking for all students. It provides many projects and resources for educator use.
- <u>The Young Writers Project</u> is a forum for young writers and artists to share their work, get feedback, and find an authentic audience. They also have a resource page.
