With its students leading the change, Maple Run Unified School District (MRUSD), which includes Bellows Free Academy (BFA) Saint Albans, Fairfield Center School, Northwest Career and Technical Center (NCTC), Saint Albans City School, and Saint Albans Town Educational Center (SATEC) exemplifies family engagement core principles by partnering with their communities, supporting the success of students, and creating a welcoming environment. Coffee and donuts were served by students in the school library to veterans and their family members. The breakfast was followed by a ceremony of music and three short speeches.
