<u>Discipline Discussions: Informal Removals Matter | Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services Blog:</u> Information and reminders of informal removals for students on IEPs.

Reminder: In July 2022, OSEP released the most <u>comprehensive IDEA discipline requirements</u> <u>guidance package</u> since the law was passed in 2004. Notably, this guidance:

- Defines informal removals;
- Describes situations in which informal removals could indicate that a child's IEP does not appropriately address their behavioral needs (<u>Question C-3</u>);
- Describes how informal removals could constitute a disciplinary removal (<u>Question C-6</u>);
- Highlights evidence-based practices that address behavior using proactive and preventative strategies.

# **Professional Development Opportunities**

March 16, 3:00 – 4:00 General Educators: Impact of Special Education Rule Changes Office Hour Please join us for an office hour intended to support the special education rule changes and the impact it has on general educators. General educators are integral to the special education process. Established systems should be in place that directly involve general educators in ensuring appropriate instruction and interventions supports are provided for all students. A webinar will be shared prior to this office hour to support general educators with the special education rule changes that are scheduled to fully take effect on July 1st, 2023. The webinar reviews the background of the rule changes and act 173, identifying how each category impacts the work of general educators. **March 14**, 3:00-4:00 Assistive Technology- What do educators working with students with disabilities need to know?

Audience – Special Educators, 504 coordinators, CTE Special Needs Coordinators. This session will delve into the considerations for assistive technology (AT) for students with disabilities. As a special educator, how do you know when the IEP team should be considering AT? What are some common signs that a student could benefit from AT? How does AT help students access their education? How does AT tie into postsecondary transition planning? These questions will be explored and discussed. Presenters: **Phil Seiler** has been the Vermont Assistive Technology Director since 2019 after a 20+ year career in Information Technology. **Fred Jones** is the Director of the State Division for the Blind and Visually Impaired. He has experience as a classroom teacher, special educator, and a Teacher of the Visually Impaired. **Ben Wimette** – has been with The Assistive Technology Program in partnership with UVM Center on Disability and Community Inclusion since 2014.
