A statistical sample of the free and reduced applications was reviewed. From the reviewed sample, it was identified that ten applications were missing required application information and two applications were categorized incorrectly. An evaluation of the benefit issuance/Point of Service list was conducted and compared to the master list to identify errors. One benefit issuance error was identified.
