

# School Nutrition Programs Administrative Review Summary

Section 207 of the HHKFA amended section 22 of the NSLA (42 U.S.C. 1769c) to require State agencies to report the final results of the School Nutrition Programs Administrative Review to the public in an accessible, easily understood manner in accordance with guidelines promulgated by the Secretary. ## **Review Findings**

#### A. Meal Access and Reimbursement

**1. Certification and Benefit Issuance** – Validation of the SFA certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals.

**Finding Detail:** (1) Two students were incorrectly certified for free meals based on income, (2) one household application was incorrectly denied, (3) free and reduced-price meal applications were not approved in a timely manner, (4) the SFA did not draw down the direct certification list in the required time frame, and (5) the SFA does not currently have a designated determining official.

**2. Verification** – Validation of the process used by the SFA to confirm selected students' eligibility for free and reduced-price meals.

**Finding Detail:** Note: Verification was not required because the SFA did not have approved applications in file on October 1 due to their failure to approve applications timely.

**3. Meal Counting and Claiming** – Validation of the SFA meal counting and claiming system that accurately counts, records, consolidates, and reports the number of reimbursable meals claimed by category.

**Finding Detail:** The claim for reimbursement was incorrectly consolidated for breakfast and lunch during the review period.

## B. Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

**1. Meal Components and Quantities** – Validation that meals claimed for reimbursement contain the required meal components / food components and quantities.

**Finding Detail:** (1) An unallowable milk type was served during the week of review, (2) production records were not completed consistently or accurately for the review period, (3) ¾ cup of the vegetable component was not offered as required on three occasions during the week of review, (4) the "milk enhancer" alternate meal offered on the day of review did not contain a grain or vegetable component, and (5) hot vended meals delivered for lunch on the day of review were not transported in insulted bags or containers.



**2. Offer versus Serve (OVS)** – Validation of SFA compliance with provision that allows students to decline some of the food components offered.

**Finding Detail:** Staff are not adequately trained on Offer versus Serve (OVS) requirements.

 Dietary Specifications and Nutrient Analysis – Validation that meals offered to children through the school meal programs are consistent with federal standards.

**Finding Detail:** (1) The SFA does not have a civil rights complaint procedure for School Nutrition Programs, and (2) the SFA did not have documentation on file to show program staff and district staff that have duties related to the program completed required annual civil rights training in the 2023-2024 school year.

2. SFA On-site Monitoring – Validation that each SFA with more than one school operating the NSLP performs required onsite reviews as specified by regulations.

3. Local School Wellness Policy and School Meal Environment –

**Finding Detail:** Standards for all foods and beverages provided, but not sold, to students during the school day was not included in the current Wellness Policy.

**4. Smart Snacks in School** – Validation of the SFA compliance with regulations for all food and beverages to students outside of the reimbursable meal.

**5. Professional Standards** – Validation of the SFA compliance with required hiring standards and annual training requirements.

Finding Detail: (1) The new Food Service Director (FSD) in the 2023-2024 school year did not have documentation on file to show an 8-hour food safety training course was completed within the first 30 calendar days of being hired, and (2) Lincoln Town School District is a new public SFA in the 2023-2024 school year and was approved to begin operating the School Nutrition Programs (SNP) on September 8, 2023. Upon approval, the interim Superintendent assumed the roles of Food Service Director, Business Manager, Claim Contact, Determining Official, and Verifying Official. The interim Superintendent's last day was December 15, 2023, and the SFA has not designated staff to take over Program roles.

**6.** Water – Documentation that children have access to water during the lunch and breakfast meal services.

**7. Food Safety and Storage –** Validation that schools meet food safety and storage requirements.
