Review Findings

- A. Meal Access and Reimbursement
 - Certification and Benefit Issuance Validation of the SFA certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals YES □ NO⊠
 - Verification Validation of the process used by the SFA to confirm selected students' eligibility for free and reduced-price meals

YES IND Finding Detail: Some teachers responsible for Breakfast in the Classroom did not receive training. During breakfast observation on the day of review, not all teachers took Point of Service (POS) meal counts. Meal count cover sheets need to be assessed.

B. Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

1. Meal Components and Quantities – Validation that meals claimed for reimbursement contain the required meal components / food components and quantities

Finding Detail: Additional training is needed on CACFP Family Style requirements for pre-k teachers. The Sun Butter and Jelly sandwich offered at lunch must be provided with the cheese stick to ensure 2 ounces of meat/meat alternate.

Finding Detail: Additional Offer vs. Serve training is needed for teachers responsible for Breakfast in the Classroom.

 Finding Detail: The SFA flagged for revenue from non-program foods and needs to complete the Non-Program Food Revenue Tool.

D. General Program Compliance

Finding Detail: The Wellness Policy is missing a policy for food and beverage marketing and has not completed an assessment on the implementation of the Wellness Policy. This is a repeat finding.

 Smart Snacks in School – Validation of the SFA compliance with regulations for all food and beverages to students outside of the reimbursable meal

Finding Detail: Some of the beverages sold at the school store do not meet Smart Snacks requirements and all food and beverages sold at the school store need to be documented as Smart Snack compliant through the Alliance for a Healthier Generation's Smart Snack calculator. A study needs to be done to assess the amount of cream and sugar provided with the coffee sold to the high school students and signage is required to ensure that coffee is not sold to younger students.



5. Professional Standards – Validation of the SFA compliance with required hiring standards and annual training requirements

Finding Detail: Professional standards training hours were not tracked for the Food Service Director. An incorrect required number of hours was listed for one staff member.

Finding Detail: Boxes of food were stored directly on the ground. This is a repeat finding. Dish chemicals were stored on top of boxes of food, a chest freezer was missing a thermometer, temperatures were not tracked for all cold storage units, and tongs were not provided for the selection of ready-to-eat fruit.
