**Finding Detail:** The SFA's Community Eligibility Provision documentation does not support the Identified Student Percentages and claiming percentages in the reimbursement system. One site was sending home free and reduced meal applications during CEP documentation.

**Finding Detail:** On-Point Elementary at Congress Street is not doing point of service meal counts and meals for that site are not tracked separately. Some meal counts at Monument were not taken at the point of service.

information. Insufficient legumes were offered. Several offerings included insufficient grain or meat/meat alternate components.
