- The Supervisory Union does not have adequate paperwork showing how claiming percentages were established provision 2 in the base year of 15-16.
- The SU has been collecting free and reduced price lunch applications instead of household income forms to establish household income information for unrelated programs.

- The meal counts in the pre k- 6 grade classrooms is an attendance based system therefore meal counts are not taken correctly.
- None of the breakfasts observed in the classroom were reimbursable as each student was not served all the necessary components.

- Accurate meal pattern documentation is not being completed or kept on file.
- Pre K meal counts are attendance based.



- Pre k students that are not comingled must receive meals that meat the CACFP meal pattern.
- Beverage cups for milk are too small for the required 8 ounces of milk.
- Menu worksheets indicate that the legume vegetable subgroup is not being offered.
