#### **REVIEW FINDINGS**

#### A. Program Access and Reimbursement

**1. Certification and Benefit Issuance –** Validation of the SFA certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals

**Finding Detail:** Errors occurred with carrying over eligibility and incomplete / incorrect applications. Evidence seen of students receiving an incorrect level of benefits. Applications must be complete to be approved.

**2. Verification** – Validation of the process used by the SFA to confirm selected students' eligibility for free and reduced-price meals

**Finding Detail:** An application was selected for verification that had been incorrectly approved initially; a confirmation review is required.

 Meal Counting and Claiming – Validation of the SFA meal counting and claiming system that accurately counts, records, consolidates, and reports the number of reimbursable meals claimed by category

**Finding Detail:** There are no edit checks in place to ensure that meal claims are correct.

## B. Meal Patterns and Nutritional Quality

1. **Meal Components and Quantities** – Validation that meals claimed for reimbursement contain the required meal components / food components and quantities

**Finding Detail:** Incorrect grain components and meat / meat alternates were observed. Recipes required modification. Meal signage should be updated to reflect reimbursable meal information.

Offer versus Serve – Validation of SFA compliance with provision that allows students to decline some of the food components offered

**Finding Detail:** At breakfast, students must be offered 4 items and take a minimum of 3. Students must have at least ½ cup of fruit or vegetable for both breakfast and lunch.

 Dietary Specifications and Nutrient Analysis – Validation that meals offered to children through the school meal programs are consistent with federal standards

**Finding Detail:** Butter with trans-fat was found. Food items must indicate zero grams of trans-fat per serving.



### C. General Compliance

1. **Civil Rights** – Validation of SFA compliance with civil rights requirements as applicable to the Child Nutrition Programs

**Finding Detail:** A written Civil Rights Complaint Procedure is needed. The correct non-discrimination statement was not being utilized. Mandatory training had not been completed. Old version of "And Justice for All" poster was being used.

**3. Local School Wellness Policy** – Documentation of compliance with the established Local School Wellness Policy

**Finding Detail:** The current Wellness Policy should be updated and made available to public.

**4. Smart Snacks** – Validation of the SFA compliance with regulations for all food and beverages to students outside of the reimbursable meal

**Finding Detail:** Soda was available from vending machines during the day.

**5. Professional Standards** – Validation of the SFA compliance with required hiring standards and annual training requirements

**Finding Detail:** Staff are not on track to meet professional standards. More regular staff meetings and other training options would be beneficial.

6. Food Safety, Storage, Buy American – Validation that schools meet food safety and storage requirements and comply with Buy American provisions specified by regulation YES ☒ NO□

**Finding Detail:** Health inspection report should be posted. No food safety plan seen. Observation and logging of temperatures should be implemented with intervention if issues occur. Tongs should be added for bagels and fruit.

7. Summer and Breakfast Program Outreach – Validation that SFA informs families of the availability of breakfasts offered under the School Breakfast Program and meals offered through the Sumer Food Service Program

Finding Detail: SFA was not conducting SFSP outreach.
