Overview of Grant

What is the School PCB Grant?

Through Act 78 of 2023, the Vermont State Legislature made the following appropriations to support public and independent schools with a PCB School Action Level exceedance:

- 1) Grants to schools in the State that are required to conduct investigation, remediation, or removal of PCB contamination in the school after Agency of Natural Resources testing but have not received a grant from the Agency of Education for the costs of investigation, remediation, or removal. The grants shall be in an amount sufficient to pay for 100 percent of the school's investigation, remediation, or removal costs required by the Agency of Natural Resources Investigation and Remediation of Contaminated Properties Rule, including the costs incurred, when necessary, under State or federal law to relocate students to a facility during remediation or removal activities.
- 2) Grants to schools in the State that conducted investigation, remediation, or removal of PCBs in the school after Agency of Natural Resources testing and received a grant for 80 percent of the costs of remediation or removal from the Agency of Education. The grants under this subdivision (2) shall be in an amount that will reimburse the school for any remediation or removal costs not paid by the Agency of Natural Resources.*

Who is eligible to apply for funding?

All Vermont Supervisory Unions/Supervisory Districts (SU/SDs) and Independent Schools are eligible to apply.

The funds appropriated by the Legislature to address costs specifically related to efforts to identify the source of PCB contamination, implement mitigation efforts to reduce the level of PCBs in indoor air quality in school buildings, and remediate (remove) PCB containing materials can be accessed by all Vermont Schools, SU/SDs & Independent Schools.

The Agency of Education (AOE) has been tasked with disbursing these funds for costs approved by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).



What are the eligible costs?

Specific *eligible costs* are defined in the "Work Plan/Cost Estimate Approval" letter provided by DEC.

Cost eligibility, by statute (Act 78, Section C112.b.1), will be determined by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). These may include costs associated with consultant and contractor services as part of the source investigation, mitigation, and remediation process; costs associated with the leasing of alternate learning spaces and transportation to those locations; purchase of equipment, supplies or services to effect approved mitigation strategies; and other approved costs to address the reduction of PCB in indoor air and removal of PCB contaminated materials from the school, as directed by the DEC.

SU/SDs and Independent Schools are eligible to request reimbursement under this grant retroactive to August 1, 2022. Once they receive a grant award, applicants should submit for reimbursement/final close out within 120 days upon receipt of invoice from a consultant or vendor.



How does our school receive reimbursement?

The applicant must submit for reimbursement/final close out within 120 days upon receipt of an invoice. The accounting detail should demonstrate that the applicant has paid 100% of the invoiced costs.

- -Complete the School PCB Grant application.
- -Once approved, the applicant receives a grant award notification.
- -Submit for reimbursement of costs.
- *If the same project/school incurs additional costs and receives additional DEC approval, the SU/SD or Independent School needs to create a new application (they cannot amend this application to increase the award amount) and name it appropriately (e.g. Cabot Elementary 2).




Is there a deadline to submit the application?

- No deadline to apply, but as of the date of this presentation (10/11/2023), there is a limited amount of funds available to support these grants (\$13.5 million per Act 78 of 2023).
- The AOE recommends submitting your application as soon as you have your DEC approval letter(s) and requires that you close the grant award out (submit for final reimbursement) within 120 days of receiving an invoice.

Application Process

Step 1- Receive letter

You will receive a Work Plan/Cost Estimate Approval letter on DEC letterhead (pictured below) with Not To Exceed Dollar Amount:




Step 3- Find Grant in FY 24

Scroll down to Available Continuation Grant:




Step 4- Select Grant

Click triangle next to School PCB Grant to open up menu:




Step 5- Create a new application

Step 7- Application Main Page


