COVID-19 Emergency Funds and Supports Overview for Vermont's Independent Schools

Updates from Previous Overview (June 2021)

- GEER EANS August 23, 2021 deadline for seeking reimbursement and starting procurement process has passed
 - Schools continue to work with AOE for reimbursement and to procure goods/services
- FCC Emergency Connectivity Fund application deadline passed
 - Second round of funding becoming available (see slide 5)
- FEMA deadline has been extended to December 31, 2021
- ARP Indoor Air Quality Grant II (Efficiency Vermont)
 was delayed by state planning process

ARP EANS

US Department of Education Requirements:

- Procurement only, no reimbursement
- Same allowable cost categories as GEER EANS
- AOE must submit state plan/application by 9/9/21.
 - Includes more specific requirements to target lowincome students and "most impacted by COVID-19"
- \$2,628,000 (estimate)
- From date of award, AOE will have 6 months to obligate funds (same timeline as GEER EANS)



FCC Emergency Connectivity Fund Program

Second window for applications open **September 28 to October 13, 2021**

- Eligible applicants include non-profit independent schools that currently qualify for e-Rate or <u>would be able to qualify</u>
 - Must meet the statutory definition of elementary & secondary schools in Elementary & Secondary Education Act
 - Must get/have an FCC registration and sam.gov registration
- Eligible costs include laptop, tablets, Wi-Fi hotspots, routers, modems, and broadband connections/internet access services for students, staff for off-campus locations
 - Purchased between July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022
 - \$400 per laptop; \$250 per hotspot

FEMA Updates

- Deadline to apply for FEMA public assistance extended to December 31, 2021
- Still 100% reimbursement for <u>FEMA</u> eligible costs
- FEMA may be extending eligible costs back to the start of the pandemic. No official statement as of August 27, 2021.
- A dedicated team is available to help schools complete FEMA applications.



ARP Indoor Air Quality Grant

- Act 9 (H.315) appropriated an additional \$15
 million to continue the IAQ grant through
 Efficiency Vermont for HVAC projects (through
 ARP State Recovery Fiscal Fund)
- Eligible entities include Approved Independent Schools
- Period of performance through December, 2024
- AOE is working with EVT to draft out the program and will communicate more details early fall 2021

- School Surveillance Testing Program:
- Free COVID-19 tests for students (ages 5 and up)and staff, regardless of vaccination status.
- Complete <u>Intent to Participate</u> as soon as possible.

HEPA Portable Air Purifiers for Schools

- HEPA Portable Air Purifier resource distribution: **DUE September 7, 2021**.
- Complete webform.
- Follow up information will be provided once the state procures the purifiers and delivery will be arranged.
- No cost to schools.
- CDC and ASHRAE recommended for classrooms with inadequate ventilation.

- Clinics at schools across the state open to students and staff from independent schools.
- New clinics at schools posted weekly.

 - Map of clinics and link to register
