Relationship between AOE and SBE Act 98 of 2012:

- Established the Agency of Education
- Elevated the Commissioner to a cabinet-level Secretary of Education
 - Appointed by Governor
 - Reports directly to Governor
- SBE no longer responsible for overseeing AOE's policies, programs, or resources
- SBE still retains oversight with respect to rulemaking process
- AOE responsible for implementing rules and regulations adopted by the SBE



Unique Position of SBE

- Independent Board of Citizens
- Neutral Body
 - Act consistent with legislative intent
 - Advise the General Assembly when asked
- Public Meeting Space
- Instrumentality of General Assembly
 - Ex.: School district mergers pursuant to Act 46 of 2015 implemented the legislature's vision for consolidation of school governance as a means of improving equity, excellence, and efficiency in the state's PreK-12 education system.
