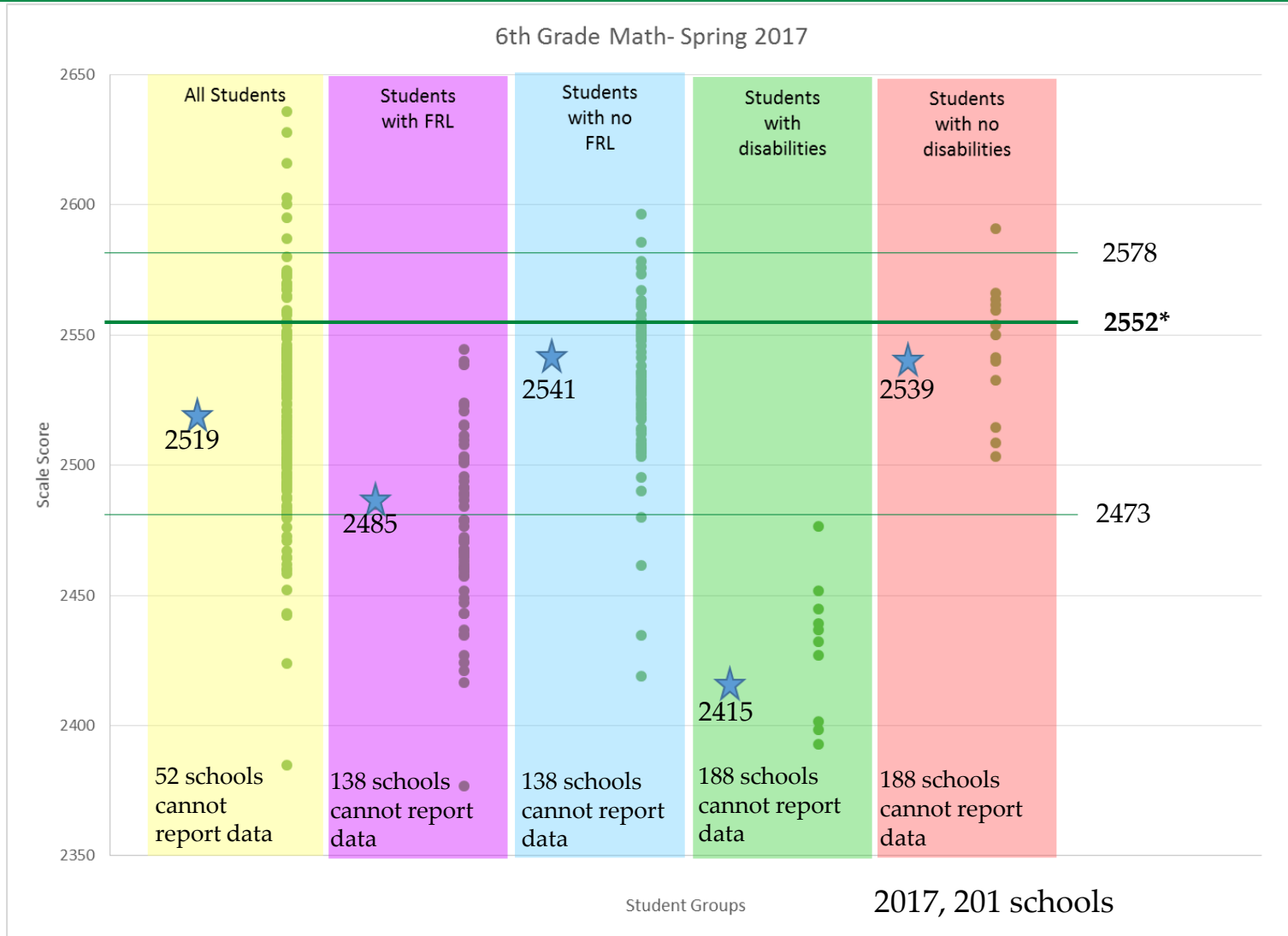

Educational Equity

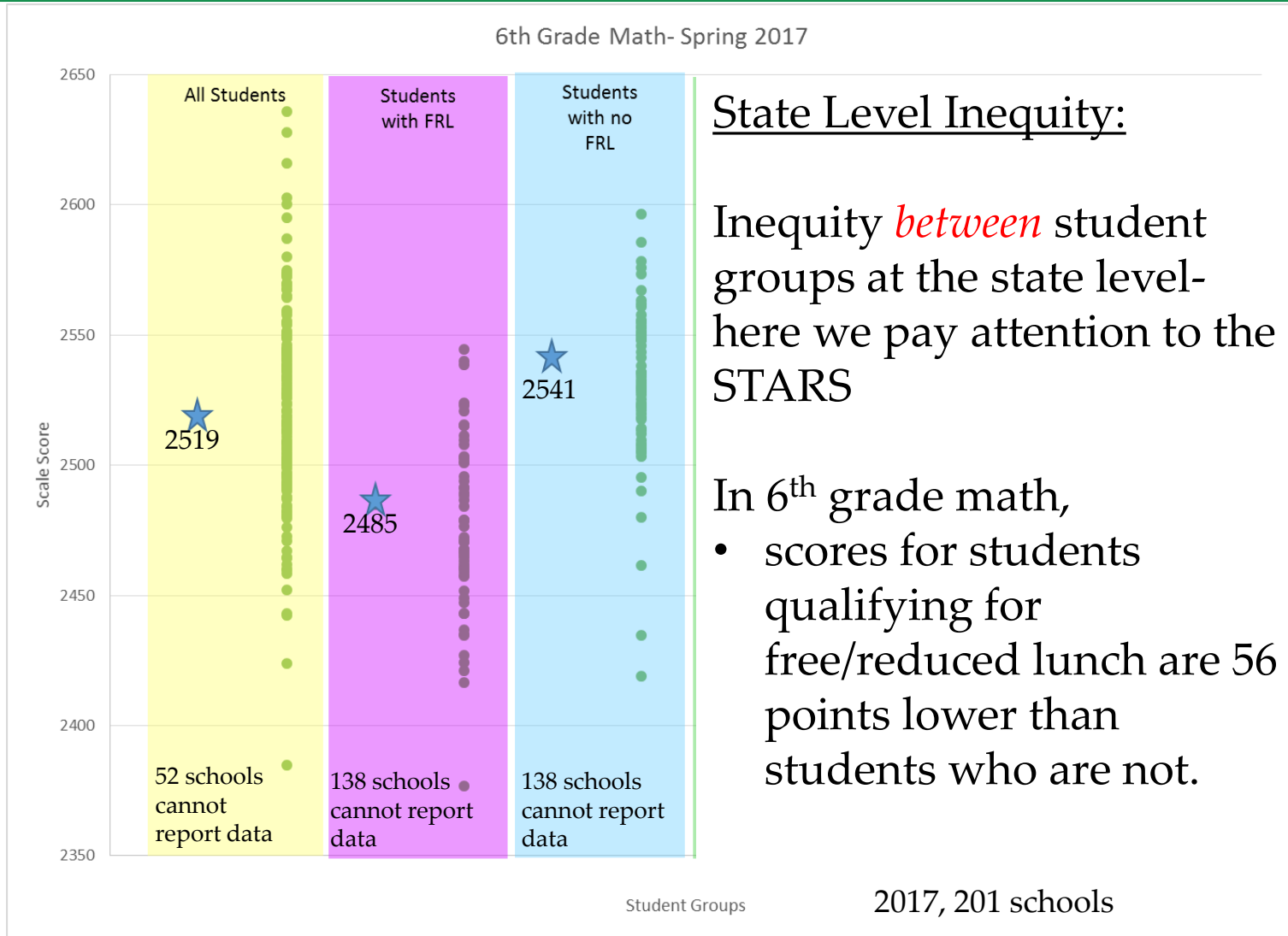

Exploring Patterns of Inequity 1



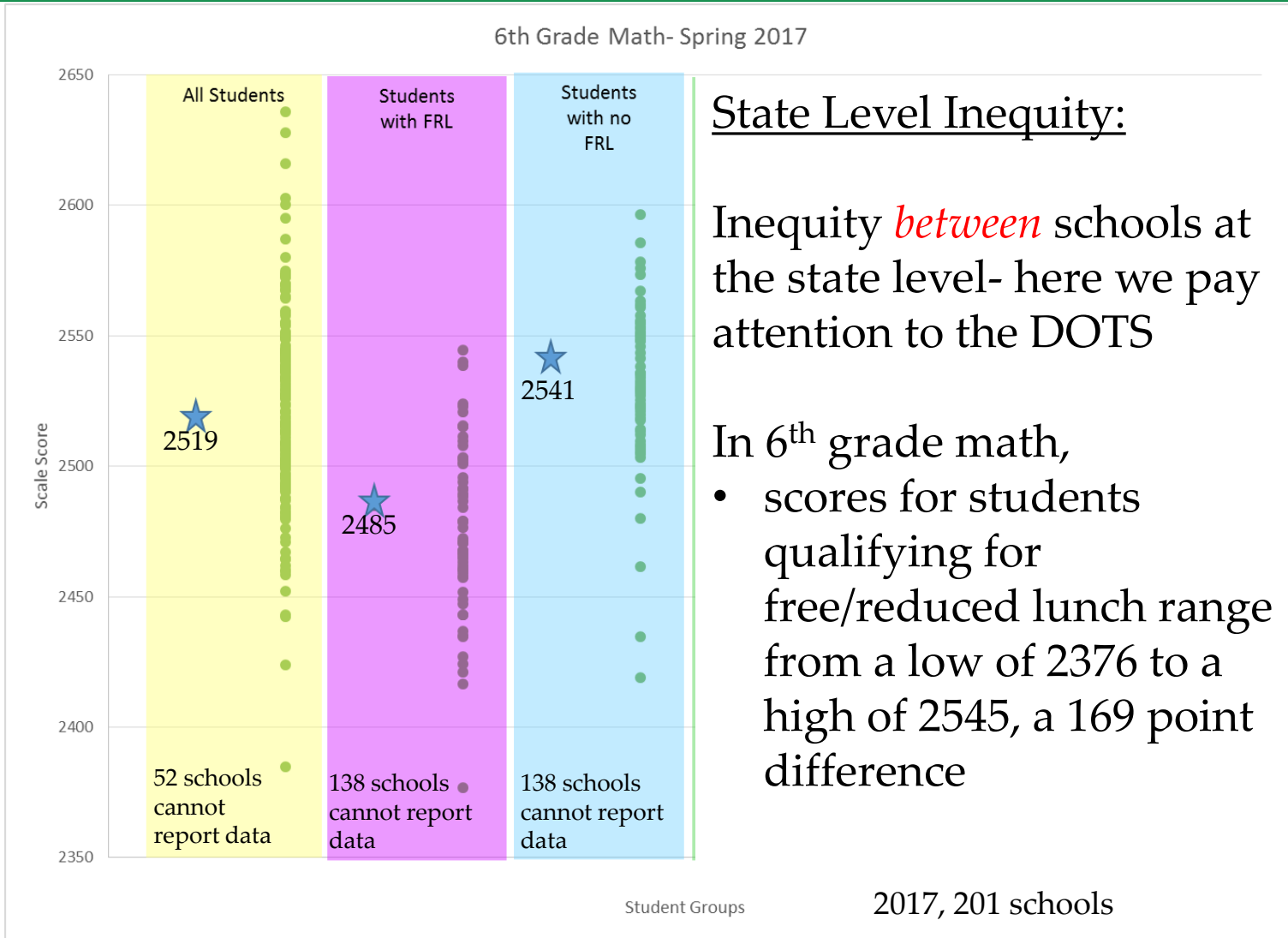
State Level Inequity:

Inequity *between* student groups at the state level- here we pay attention to the STARS

In 6th grade math,

- scores for students qualifying for free/reduced lunch are 56 points lower than students who are not.

Exploring Patterns of Inequity 2



State Level Inequity:

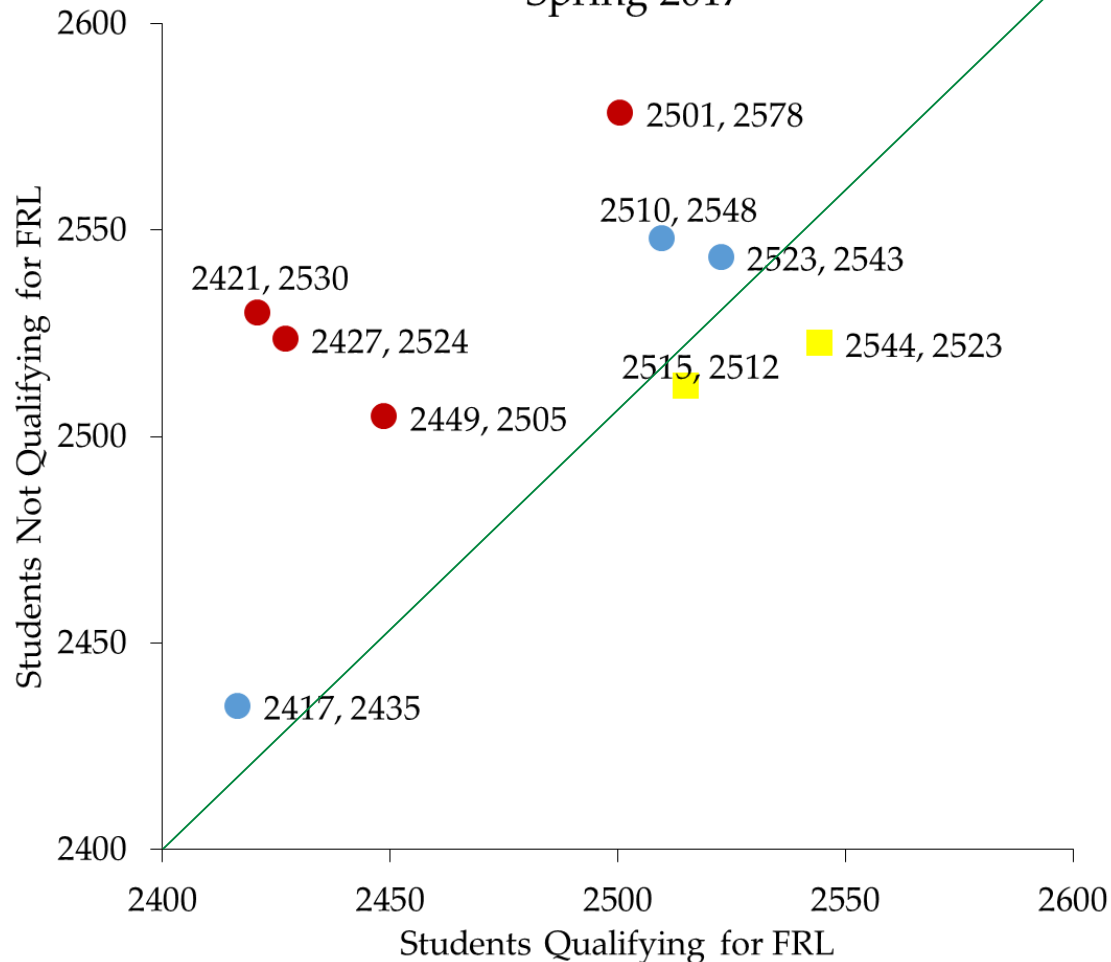
Inequity *between* schools at the state level- here we pay attention to the DOTS

In 6th grade math,

- scores for students qualifying for free/reduced lunch range from a low of 2376 to a high of 2545, a 169 point difference

Spring 2017



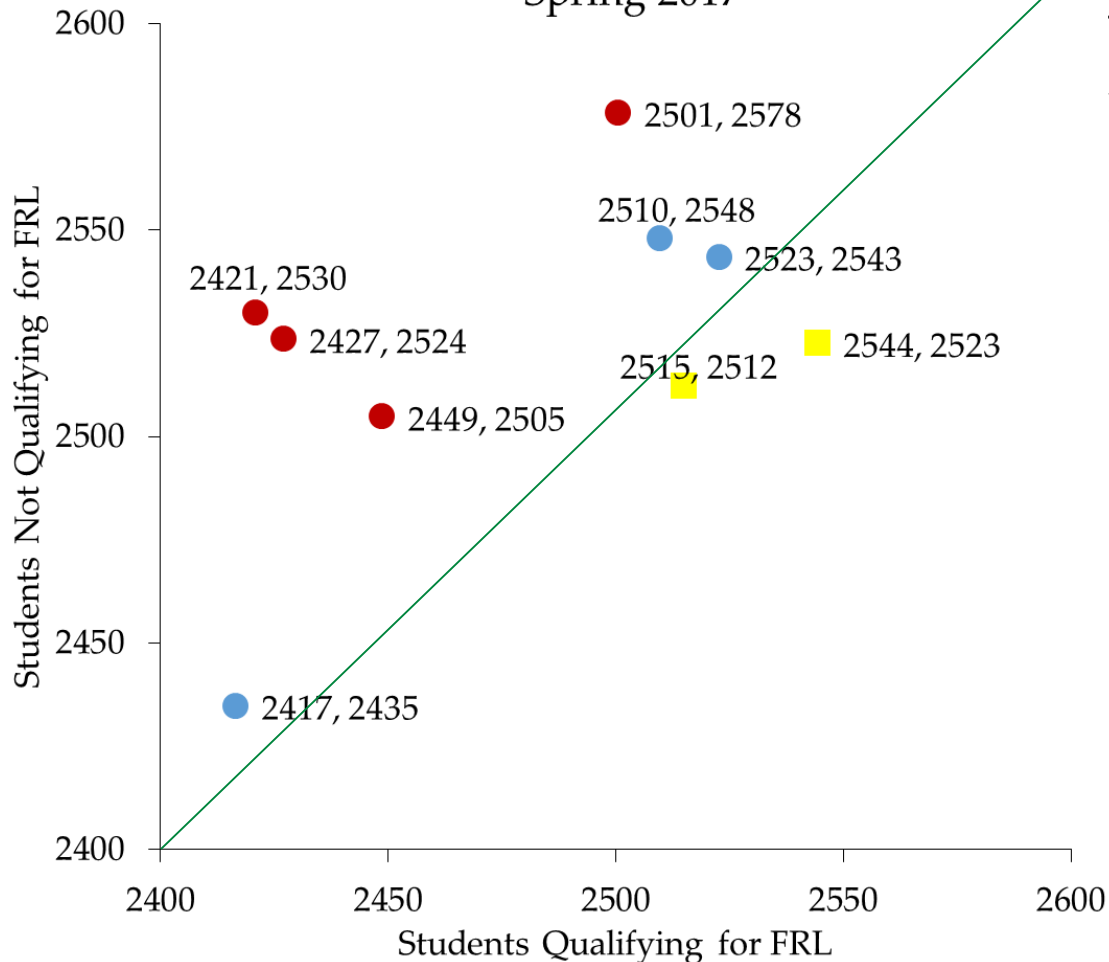
School Level Inequity:

Within schools there are varying levels of inequity *between* student groups.

- Some schools have students with FRL that outperform students that aren't eligible for FRL

Comparison of School Averages for 6th Grade Math
Spring 2017



School Level Inequity:

Within schools there are varying levels of inequity *between* student groups.

- Some schools have students with FRL that have lower scores by 50 or more points compared to students not eligible for FRL
