


### **Educational Equity**



Inequity *between* student groups at the state levelhere we pay attention to the STARS


In 6<sup>th</sup> grade math,

Inequity *between* schools at the state level- here we pay attention to the DOTS


In 6<sup>th</sup> grade math,


# School Level Inequity:
