

Title I Part A School Eligibility Waiver Application

Background

Section 1113 of The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) stipulates that in order for a school to be served under Title I Part A it must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- The school must serve a student population with at least 35% qualifying as low-income; or
- The percentage of students who are low-income must be at or above the LEA average for all schools; or
- The percentage of students who are low-income must be at or above the LEA average for schools serving the same grade span.

These criteria do not apply to LEAs that serve fewer than 1,000 students or in cases where a school is the only school serving a particular grade span in an LEA.

Eligibility Waiver

Under its Ed-Flex authority, the Vermont Agency of Education is able to waive the above eligibility requirements for a school that meets the following criterion:

- The rate of students who are low-income is not more than ten percentage points below that of a Title I-eligible school in the LEA, not including those eligible by grandfathering.

If waivers are sought for multiple schools, individual waiver applications must be submitted for each. If granted, waivers will apply for one year only.

Schools eligible through a waiver may operate as Title I Targeted Assistance programs only.

Example

In the example below, the low-income average of the LEA is 17.6%. Both Apple and Walnut are Title I-eligible due to serving low-income populations that are at or above the LEA average. Maple and Oak's low-income percentages are within 10% of Walnut's, the Title I-eligible school with the lowest low-income rate.
