### **Vermont Learning Collaborative History**

- VTLC was in existence as a non-profit, providing districts with professional development and fiscal agent services since 2014.
- Approximately 7 years ago, two area Superintendents were invited to be on the VTLC Board with intention to shift the agency to become a regional services organization.
- Regional Superintendent group discussed regional programming for specialized programs to be run by the Collaborative, housing programs within districts to provide Least Restrictive Environment solutions.
- Exploration of regional collaboration opportunities, including services and programming was initiated.
- Regional SUs/SDs provided seed money & additional members joined from 8 SUs/SDs.
- VTLC Contracted with New Solutions K12 to hire an Executive Director with regional collaboration experience.
- VTLC currently has 8 Board members, an Executive Director, part-time Administrative Assistant, and other contracted employees.



## Vision

The Vermont Learning Collaborative has been revamped with the aim to provide regional, effective, and efficient support around solutions to challenges including, but not limited to:

- Addressing hard to fill positions;
- Coordinating placement into existing, district-run, substantially separate programs that have capacity;
- Providing cost effective and timely evaluations and services;
- Developing and managing school-based, collaborative-run, programs for high needs, low incidence disabilities;
- High quality professional development; and more.



## The Challenges

- Private non-profit limitations to provide specialized programming
- Requires flexibility in thinking and commitment to utilizing agency services
- Geography vast area to service
- Lack of facility space options need to identify classroom space opportunities within existing district buildings
- Limited funding sources
- Recruitment of highly qualified specialty staff
- Competing with well-established specialty agencies

Despite having access to multiple established resources, supervisory unions and districts still struggle with capacity to meet ever-changing needs.

**Boards of Cooperative Education Services (BOCES) / Service Agencies** provide shared resources and responsive solutions to meet a variety of short- and long-term regional challenges in a cost-effective manner.





## **BOCES Solution**

- Create regional efficiency with shared staffing resources, professional development initiatives, BOCES programs, and services;
- Meet the growing need for high quality, substantially separate special education programs that are geographically more accessible;
- Fill short-term gaps in staffing;
- Offer consultation services to build capacity or manage projects for supervisory unions;
- Pool resources for cooperative purchasing, transportation, and other needs.

## What is Needed
