



Universal PreK (UPK) Café Special Issue - October 25, 2024

With the presidential election upon us, this UPK Café special issue will discuss developmentally appropriate practices (DAP) and implementation of citizenship skills. For this special issue the following resources are referenced, Education for a Civil Society: Teaching Young Children to Gain the Five Democratic Life Skills (Gartrell, 2023) based upon the Vermont Early Learning Standards (VELS)-Social Studies that align with National Council on the Social Studies (NCSS) and NCSS's College, Career, and Civic Life (C3) Framework.

Preamble

The Preamble states, We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union. As educators how do we develop and foster citizenship skills "to form a more perfect Union" within our classrooms? The **Five Democratic Life Skills (DLS)** (Gartrell, 2023) promotes the following skills: belonging, acceptance, perspective taking, conflict resolution, advocacy, executive functioning (self-regulation) and group building skills. Utilizing the five DLS and the VELS, educators can support and implement developmentally appropriate citizenship skills within their classrooms.

Five Democratic Life Skills (DLS)

- **DLS 1** Finding acceptance as a member of a group and as a worthy individual.
 - Belonging and inclusion
- **DLS 2** Expressing strong emotions in non-hurting ways.
 - Executive function and self-regulation
- **DLS 3** Solving problems creatively-independently and in cooperation with others.
 - Conflict resolution and problem solving independently and in a group setting
- **DLS 4** Accepting differing human qualities in others.
 - Describe differences/similarities in others. Cultural differences/similarities always try to find the commonalities
- **DLS 5** Thinking intelligently and ethically.
 - Kindness, fairness, advocating, pre-leadership skills, and group skills.



VELS and DLS in Practice

The table below demonstrates how each of the DLS skills aligns with several VELS domains and developmental skills for PreK-Grade 3.

DSL 1 Belonging and inclusion	VELS Social Studies; Element 2. Family and Community, Civics, Government, and Society	Basic citizenship skills such as rule making and compliance, and how these change in different settings (school, home, community). DSL 2 Executive function and self-regulation	VELS Developing Self: Element 1. Emotion and Self- Regulation	Building upon executive functioning skills (self- regulation) is important for being able to be a good "citizen" when working in groups.	Maintain citizenship skills.
DSL 3 Conflict resolution and problem solving independently and in a group setting	VELS Developing Self Element 2. Self- awareness and Element 3. Relationships with Adults and Peers	Citizenship skills involve conflict resolution through non-confrontational problem solving with adult support.	Citizen skills students can identify behaviors that foster cooperation in groups and conflict resolution through non-confrontational problem solving (independently and within a group without adult support).
DSL 4 Acceptance Describe differences/ similarities in others. Cultural differences/ similarities always try to find the commonalities	VELS Social Studies; Element 3 Physical and Cultural Geography	Expanding on concept of community by identifying culture, language and beliefs by acceptance of differences and highlighting commonalities.	Maintain citizenship skills.

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DLS	VELS	PreK/K/Grade 1 Skills	Grades 2 and 3 Skills
DSL 5 Kindness, fairness, advocating, pre-leadership and group skills	VELS Social Studies; Element 2 Family and Community, Civics, Government, and Society	Citizenship skills for working in groups kindness (belonging) and fairness (equality).	Maintain citizenship skills.

Expanding to Global Citizenship

Building upon citizenship skills towards global citizenship skills by promoting alignment with the <u>National Council on the Social Studies</u> (NCSS) and NCSS's <u>College, Career, and Civic Life (C3)</u> Framework for PreK through Grade 3 by referencing the **VELS Element 3 Physical and Cultural Geography** developmental indicators.

 As a global citizen it is developmentally appropriate for students to identify similarities and differences from others (cultural, likes and dislikes, gender, skin color, hair, and eye color). Best practice is having materials and visuals that are representative of people, cultures and the community in which they live.
